The company has, over the years, involved itself in several larger international projects; Panta Rei Danseteater (PRD) led the EEA-project GODOS together with the Lithuanian dance company AURA, touring both countries and developing audience development strategies that led to a larger number of people in both countries enjoying dance theatre. Since 2011, PRD has collaborated with MUDA Africa to develop a professional centre for dance in Dar es Salaam in Tanzania.

The company has many ongoing collaborative relationships worldwide. This includes regularly touring to the South West of England, visiting Cornwall, Devon and Dorset since 2004 with both performances and outreach programs. We hope to continue to develop our international relations in the years to come and embark on larger artistic collaborations across the world.
